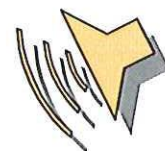

Just a reminder about Personal Floatation Devices

All recreational vessels must have approved wearable PFD for each person. All Boats over 16 Feet must also have a throwable flotation device. This includes canoes and kayaks.

NOTE: All persons less than six years of age shall wear a Type I or Type II PFD at all times when riding in the open deck area of a boat.

Safety Tips



Some things to remember:

To make sure that your PFDs remain in good condition.

- Do not alter the PFDs.
 - An altered PFD no longer meets legal requirements and may not save your life.
- Do not place heavy objects on PFDs during storage.
- Do not use PFDs as kneeling pads, boat fenders, or seat cushions because they lose buoyancy when they're crushed.
- Let PFDs air-dry thoroughly before putting them away.
- Always store your PFDs in a well-ventilated place, out of direct sunlight.
- Never dry your PFDs by a direct heat source, such as a dryer, heater, or radiator.
- Before wearing, check PFDs for signs of wear and age.
 - Look for rips or tears, mildew, loose or missing straps, frayed webbing, broken zippers or buckles, and hardened stuffing.

A PFD with any of these problems must be replaced.

Quick Tips

Out darned spot!

Clean stubborn stains in the head using vinegar-soaked paper towels. Just lay the wet towels over the stains or fixtures several hours or overnight. Repeat as needed for a like-new finish. *-Ed Jones*

Flare thee well

Just because the plastic cylinder looks clean and shiny doesn't mean the flares are useable. Emergency flares can disintegrate even while stored in original containers. Inspect your flares regularly, and replace deteriorated or expired devices.



Frost-free view

To prevent frost from forming on your cabin windows, add two cups of antifreeze or rubbing alcohol to a gallon of water and wash the windows with this solution. *-Ed Jones*

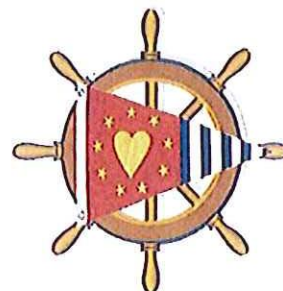

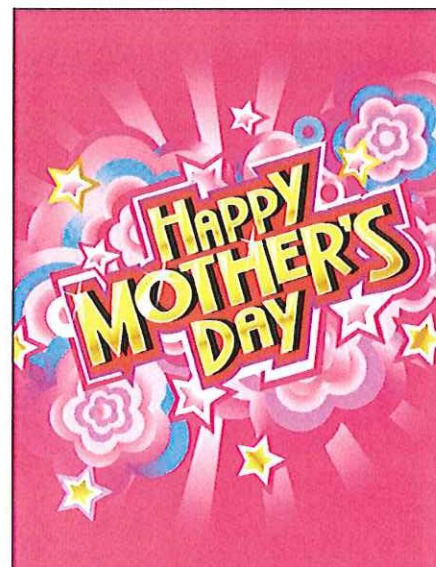

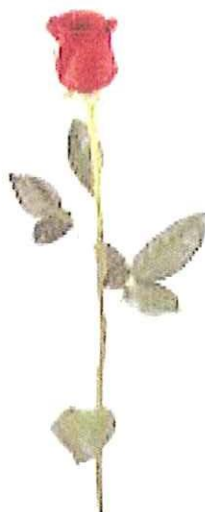

Subject: Training for On The Water Course Coming on May 18-23rd.

We have been asked to let you know about this upcoming opportunity for the ***on the water training for IN and CN certification.***

We are pleased to let you know that the USPS Boat that is supported with grant funding for use in the Boat Operator Certification program on the water exercises will be in Michigan in May....yes, just a few weeks away. At this time, we are working with Mac-Ray Harbor, Clinton Township, Michigan, on the Clinton River as a meeting location for instructions/reviews and the starting point to board the boat. The OTW exercises will be in the bay just outside of the MacRay harbor entrance. You can get to MacRay Harbor/marina facility via I-94 exiting at North River Road, taking North River Road to the Harbor's gated entrance.

Please email Denise Samu at denisesamu@comcast.net if you are interested in completing the On the Water exercise in boat handling for Inland Certification and/or navigation for Coastal Navigation. Also, please note which days you are available to be scheduled. At this time, the IN certifications will be one session in the AM and one session in the afternoon. The CN certification will require two sessions, one for candidates to plot the course, compute speed, time and distance for each leg of the course and a review of each chart with the Certifier prior to going out on the water. The second session for CN will be the OTW exercise.

Please send your name, USPS membership number, contact phone number, both home and cell phone would be helpful, days you are available to be scheduled, and email address in your email to Denise Samu, denisesamu@comcast.net.. We are putting together the list and will coordinate a schedule working to accommodate everyone. It is important that you list several days/times you are available so we can get everyone interested onto the schedule.

General Information for Inland boat handling On the Water skills:

3 people in the boat for each session plus the IN Certifier, A demo of the skills and then each person will perform the skill.

General Information for Coastal On the Water navigation

2 – 4 people in the boat for each session plus the CN Certifier, one person will pilot and demonstrate their skills, one person will be their navigator, rotation of positions will take place within each group in the boat

Bring your USPS CN Passport – this can be obtained through your Squadron SEO if you do not already have it

Each person doing the CN OTW certification will be required to plot, label and calculate the time for each leg of the course – this will be sent to you prior to the OTW training so completion can be done prior to meeting
