## Safety Tips — from Dennis Blaga



Now that our **H2O Yachts** are put away for the winter, we should have or if you haven't, check your **land yachts** for winter safety

When you think of winter, you might not be thinking about rain, especially when we live in a region that sees any amount of snow. But snowy weather is prime windshield wiper time. It's easy for tired, worn wipers to do at least an adequate job of clearing rain from your windshield, but those same wipers will fail miserably when confronted with the slimy, gritty, slushy mix of melting snow and road salt. This is why fall is a great time to replace your wipers. It's a 10-minute job that will make your life so much easier down the road.

Also remember to keep windshield washer fluid level full.

Your car tires are the only thing keeping your car on the road, so making sure you have enough tread depth to drive safely in any conditions should be a top priority. Hydroplaning in the rain is caused by a worn car tire's inability to cut through the water and touch the road, causing your car to "float" across the street's surface. The more tread on your tires, the less likely you will hydroplane. The same goes for driving in the snow.

The "Abe Lincoln" car tire test is an old one, but it's still the quickest and cheapest way to check the condition of your tires. Take a penny and stick Honest Abe's head into the groove of your tire. If it sinks in up to his hairline, you're a-ok. If not, you should consider getting new tires sometime soon.

Batteries: at the minimum, clean corrosion from the terminals and make sure the terminals are tight.

This is my **last safety article** as safety officer. I've enjoyed providing you with safety info and sometimes humorous messages these last few years. I encourage anyone in the squadron to consider this position.

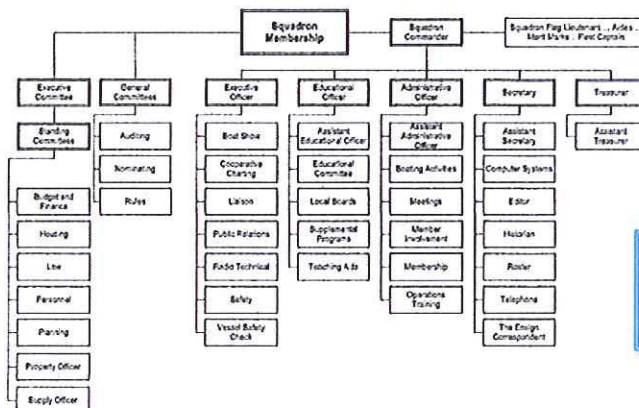
